AMERICAN RED CROSS

In the Annual Roll Call of the Porto Rico Chapter, American Red Cross, an attractive folder has been distributed which states exactly what the Red Cross is doing in the Island.

Among its many other activities the work done through the Social Welfare Department as well as that of the classes in Home Hygiene and Care of the Sick has been outstanding during the year.

Over sixteen hundred families were helped by this department in one way or another during the year and ninety-four sick persons or under-nourished infants received milk. Eight children were admitted to the Insular Anti-tuberculosis Sanatorium through the efforts of this department and 485 layettes were given to expectant mothers.

Classes in Home Hygiene and Care of the Sick were organized in the three leading eities of the Island as well as in other towns and at the University of Porto Rico. Over two hundred students were enrolled in these classes and one hundred and thirty-four received diplomas.

The Ponce Chapter, apart from its emergency relief work maintains a Day Nursery where 131 infants were cared for during the year, thus enabling needy mothers to gain and keep employment. The Mayagüez local chapter maintains a children's ward in the municipal hospital and the Aguadilla local chapter maintains a dental clinic for the poor.
