DR. A. FERNOS ISERN

Having returned from his trip to Havana, Dr. A. Fernós Isern, Assistant Commissioner of Health, is again in San Juan and at his desk.

Dr. Fernós Isern was one of the official delegates of the United States to the Fifth Pan American Congress on Child Welfare held in Havana from the 8th to the 13th of December last. A paper was presented by him to the Congress on Infant Morbidity and Mortality in Porto Rico.

Dr. Fernós returned via New York and while there held several conferences with members of the National Health Council, located at 370 Seventh Avenue, New York City. A film prepared at the Department of Health under his direction and entitled "A Panoramic Review of Public Health Activities in Porto Rico" was exhibited at the Academy of Sciences at Havana and also at New York to select audiences.

While in Havana Dr. Fernós was honored with the Honorary Chairmanship of the Section on Hygiene of the Pan-American Congress.
