DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH ACTIVITIES

The first of a series of practical demonstrations in dietetics was begun on February 14th at the Barrio Obrero Clinic of the Bureau of Social Medicine to a Pre-natal Class. The demonstration was given by a Senior Student of the Home Economies Class of the University of Porto Rico.

The dish prepared for this class was yautía soup. It was served to the class, and afterward a lecture on the food values of the ingredients was given by the teacher. The recipe was distributed to the class.

This demonstration was also given on February 16th at the Santurce Clinic of Social Medicine to a pre-natal class.

The object of these demonstrations is to interest the people in having a more varied diet, and to bring to their attention the food values of the native vegetables.
