BOOK REVIEW

PERSONAL AND COMMUNITY HEALTH, by Clair Elsmere Turner, 1930, C. V. Mosby & Co., St. Louis, Mo. \$2.75.

This volume deals with the health problems of the individual and with the health of the community. Its chief value is for students and for individuals not particularly trained in modern health knowledge. The hygiene of nutrition, of the mouth, of the central nervous system and reproduction are discussed. There are other chapters on disease prevention, communicable diseases, immunity, food control, water supply, waste disposal, school hygiene, public health administration, industrial hygiene, ventilation, disinfection, etc. The work has been carefully planned and has an easy flowing style and is therefore easily read by those not daily conversant with technical medical terms.
