VITAL STATISTICS OF PUERTO RICO

From the Government of Puerto Rico, Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics.

VIOLENT DEATHS: A total of 263 deaths from external causes has been registered during the first quarter of the year 1932, in comparison with 247 deaths from such causes during the same period of the year 1931. To this total, accidents have contributed with 127 deaths in 1932 and 130 deaths in 1931, suicides with 87 deaths in 1932, and 86 deaths in 1931, and homicides with 49 deaths in 1932 and 31 deaths in 1931.

HOMICIDES: There has been an increase of 18 deaths in the homicides occurring during the first three months of 1932, in comparison with those occurring during the same period of 1931. The classification of these homicides by the age of the deceased and by means of injury, is as follows:

MORTALITY FOR THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1932: During the second quarter of 1932, an increase of 601 deaths was registered in the general mortality of Puerto Rico, as compared with that recorded for the same period in 1931. Those caused by malaria (89) and influenza (75) being the most important in the group of transmissible diseases, in which there was a general decrease of 22 deaths. On the other hand, increases were recorded in the following causes: tuberculosis 120, syphilis 45, and measles, 17.

OTHER IMPORTANT CAUSES: Among the other important causes of death, the following show decreases: senility (39), pneumonia (25), cerebral hemorrhage (5), and and the puerperal causes (3); while increases have been registered in diarrhea and enteritis—two years and over—(205), diarrhea and enteritis—under two years—(91), diseases of the heart (55), broncho-pneumonia (46), other diseases of early infancy (congenital debility excepted) (43), congenital debility (38), cancer (30) and bronchitis (22).

The number of deaths recorded from every one of these causes during the months of April, May and June, 1932 and 1931, is shown in the following table:
